First Sunday of Advent—2 December 2017



**Three attitudes help to enter into the spirit of Advent:
WAITING, WATCHING and WELCOMING.**

Much of our life is spent in Waiting; we wait for buses, trains, for examination results or job interviews; for our medical test reports, for our salary packets or pension benefits; for the birth of a child. Waiting is not something passive or mere idleness. Waiting is eager expectation, an inner longing. Like the watchman that waits for the dawn,

we wait for the Lord. He comes to us in so many ways; in word and silence, in joy and sorrow, in sickness and health, in success and failure.

We need also to Watch. Watching demands alertness.

In the parable of the ten virgins, the five wise virgins kept watch and trimmed their lamps as they waited for the bridegroom so that when he did come, they went with him into the banquet hall. The five foolish virgins felt drowsy and fell asleep.

The Lord came and they were caught napping.

Finally, we need to Welcome Jesus. What better way to welcome Him than to remove the obstacles that prevent Him from entering. Let us welcome Him into our hearts, our homes and our lives. In the measure we welcome Jesus and make room in the inn of our hearts for Him, will our Christmas be happy and meaningful.

Through the centuries the Church has become ever more aware that Mary, "full of grace" through God, was redeemed from the moment of her conception. That is what the dogma of the Immaculate Conception confesses, as Pope Pius IX proclaimed on December 8, 1854: "The most Blessed Virgin Mary was, from the first moment of her conception, by a singular grace and privilege of almighty God and by virtue of the merits of Jesus Christ, Saviour of the human race, reserved immune from all stain of original sin." - CCC



The Advent Wreath is a widely recognised symbol of Advent. The wreath is made up of a circle of evergreen branches laid flat to symbolise the endless nature of God's love for his people. Four candles are in the circle of the wreath. Traditionally, three of the candles are purple and the fourth, the "joy" candle is pink. Purple candles emphasise our Faith, Hope and Love in God's promise fulfilled in the nativity. One candle is lit during the first week of Advent and two in the second week etc. The candles remind us of the light of God coming into the world, and the light from the candles grows brighter as each week comes closer to Christmas.

Blessing of the Advent Wreath

Priest: Lord Jesus Christ, you are the Saviour of the world. We ask you to bless this Advent wreath which we honour as a remembrance of your first coming at Bethlehem and your final coming in glory. Strengthen our hearts with the example of your love that we may receive you with joy and gladness on the day of our redemption when you will come to reign as King forever and ever.

All: Amen (*The candle is now lit*)

Leader: May the lighting of this candle help us to look forward to the fulfilment of the promise.

All: Lord, make us turn to you. Let us see your face.

Leader: May your light strengthen our hearts, increase our love and make our lives more pleasing to you.

All: Purify us, Lord, that we may be prepared for your coming.

Priest: During the Advent season may Almighty God let the light of His Son shine upon us. May He fill our hearts with joy at His coming and lead us to life everlasting.

All: Amen.

Priest: May Almighty God, have mercy on us, Forgive us our sins and bring us to everlasting life.

All: Amen.

For you hid your face from us and gave us up to the power of our sins. And yet, Lord, you are our Father; we the clay, you the potter, we are all the work of your hand.

I thank him that you have been enriched in so many ways, especially in your teachers and preachers; the witness to Christ has indeed been strong among you so that you will not be without any of the gifts of the Spirit while you are waiting for our Lord Jesus Christ to be revealed; and he will keep you steady and without blame until the last day, the day of our Lord Jesus Christ, because God by calling you has joined you to his Son, Jesus Christ; and God is faithful.
